### TURN2US INSIGHT BRIEFING: CORONAVIRUS

There has been an unprecedented surge in demand for Turn2us services since public measures were put in place to deal with the coronavirus pandemic. This briefing aims to provide an overview of both the demand for our services during this time, and the national picture of how people's lives and livelihoods in the UK are being impacted.

# CORONAVIRUS AND ITS IMPACT ON UK HOUSEHOLDS

The national measures put in place to flatten the curve lead to a huge surge in demand for our digital services. As that demand gradually steadies, our Grants team are processing an unprecedented number of applications for direct financial help by people who have lost income due to the lockdown.

In particular, the demand for our Coronavirus Grant has had thousands of applications in the short time the fund has been live on our site.

From our survey data, we can see that people are still experiencing a significant financial and emotional shock as a result of the pandemic; and that this is most acutely felt by low income households in the UK.

Across all our services, the proportion of users who are unable to afford housing costs and food are still worryingly high ; particularly among grant applicants. **More than half (58%) of grant applicants are currently unable to afford food and two-thirds (66%) cannot afford their rent** or mortgage

payments. So, although demand for our information and digital services is reducing again, the underlying causes of people searching for financial information and benefits remain. This is particularly the case for single parents, those with underlying health conditions and people who have 'slipped through the net' of government support packages.

We already know from our national survey that the percentage of single parent families anticipating that they will have £1,000 or less next month is 66%, up from 54% in February. That equates to 1.2 million single parents anticipating that they will be living on £1,000 or less next month, an increase of 216,000 compared to February, before covid-19 measures began. An alarming 42% of single parents are anticipating living on less than £500 per month.

#### The two main problems highlighted from our recent qualitative data are:

- People slipping through gaps in government support, especially when their employer will not voluntarily furlough them, and;
- The interdependence between employment, income and health vulnerabilities; as well as certain predicted characteristics such as race, gender and disability.
  Some respondents continue to speak about having to choose between their family's health and their work.



#### MAKING A DIFFERENCE TO REAL LIVES

Ryan is a self-employed chef whose work was cancelled when the lockdown came into effect. With no other income, he has no way of paying child support to his ex-partner for their daughter.
